Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night?

Being old, I still use a landline phone at home. And the only (almost) calls I get are solicitations from fundraisers to the point that I now hang up – especially when the voice seems immune to rejection. Which reminds me of last Sunday's Gospel reading about a cranky judge who wished a certain widow would stop bugging him about her case and let him get a night's sleep. The widow's persistence seems to be admired in this parable. She won't give up – until she wears the judge out – and therefore maybe we should persistently pray that God do us justice in the same way: wear him out. And the judge gets some credit for eventually getting up and attending to the widow's pleas.

But I like to think the judge is indeed the target of the parable, for how many characters have we met in history and in literature that shared this judge's impatience with pleas for help? I think of Ebenezer Scrooge as a classic example. At Christmas time he is approached by two gentlemen soliciting donations for the Poor. *At this festive season of the year, Mr. Scrooge, it is more than usually desirable that we should make some slight provision for the . . . destitute, who suffer greatly at the present time. Many thousands are in want of common necessities; hundreds of thousands are in want of common comforts, sir.*

Scrooge responds: *Are there no prisons . . . And the Union workhouses . . . and The Treadmill and the Poor Law are in full vogue?* One of the gentlemen attempts to clarify their mission: *Under the impression that they scarcely furnish Christian cheer of mind or body to the multitude, a few of us are endeavoring to raise a fund to buy . . . some meat and drink, and means of warmth . . . What shall I put you down for?* Scrooge replies: *Nothing!* The visitors mistake his response: *You wish to be anonymous?* And Scrooge emphatically says: *I wish to be left alone . . . I don't make merry myself at Christmas and I can't afford to make idle people merry.*

Isn't that similar to the initial response of the judge in our parable? And hasn't that been our response to have-nots through the centuries? My ancestors down until my great grandparents were nobodies, hard labor, week after week survival, illiterate, subject to those of aristocratic, hereditary status – bestowers of noblesse oblige but not too much noblesse, if you please. Until, since the 1600's when revolutions began to happen – English, American, French, modern protests making demands upon the impersonal, abstract, powers that be, like the widow in the parable, – often slowly and reluctantly the powers that be began to respond.

But what am I talking about? I, myself, am as bothered as the judge in the story, as the powers that be. I treasure my privacy, I hang up on the solicitors, I don't want to be bothered with other people's concerns . . . I value my comfort and security. And so last week's parable is a wake up call to all of us – beginning with that crabby judge. The widow is none other than an emissary of the Holy Spirit telling all us to pay attention to her needs and those of our fellow human beings. Perhaps I may be too bold to say that the *Holy Spirit* is in some way the instigator of such protests; perhaps it remains arguable that some such revolutions were nefarious in their intent. But - that the Holy Spirit was behind the profound revolution promoted by Jesus of Nazareth in his Sermon on the Mount - *is an article of our faith!*
